

EMGS syllabi at Roskilde University (RUC)

EMGS at RUC begin with an Introduction Day at your Global Studies programme (EMGS) at RUC. It is a common introduction for all Master students at Department of Social Sciences and Business, where you receive all relevant information on your study.

You can find the date and full schedule for your Introduction Day in RUC course catalogue on study.ruc.dk (Introduction Day to be published mid-August, select your study programme under 'Master's programmes – Single-Subject Master's – Global Studies).

All study activities of EMGS/Global Studies in the Autumn semester will be available in April in the RUC course catalogue. You have the following study activities on the four EMGS semesters at RUC (note EMGS differ slightly from Global Studies (GS) semester):

Autumn semester (1st EMGS semester)

- Foundation course in Global Studies (10 ECTS)
- Project 1: Perspectives (15 ECTS)
- Winter school (5 ECTS)

Spring semester (2nd EMGS semester)

- Global Studies Seminar or Optional Method Course I (5 ECTS)
- Optional course: Advanced study seminar (10 ECTS)
- Optional course: Advanced study seminar (10 ECTS)
- Summer school (5 ECTS)

Autumn semester (3rd EMGS semester)

- Optional course: Advanced study course (10 ECTS)
- Optional course: Seminar in Global Studies or Method Course II (5 ECTS)
- Project 2: Current Events (15 ECTS)

Spring semester (4th EMGS semester) - Sign up for master thesis spring: 1-15 November
